Gov Zero Aotearoa: creating a better & values based future together

An initiative instigated by Venture Centre that supports our diverse communities to engage, collaborate and accelerate the codesign and development, by citizens, of the digital foundations we urgently need to truly live well in Aotearoa NZ.

Exploratory Futures + Social Inclusion + Gov as a Platform

Why create Gov Zero Aotearoa?

We all rely upon, and are impacted by, the public sector every day. Whether directly, by interacting with the fragmented world of public services, or indirectly, through the decisions perpetuated through systems of government funding, policies, regulation, legislation, incentives and narratives. **Civil society has very little say, low** influence and no real participation in the decisions or governance, or the systems that enable either, with public engagement having largely become limited to a continuous slew of communications activities (aka. "You're invited to make a submission").

However, the NZ Government has a specific and binding responsibility to <u>shared governance</u>, both in its constitutional framework (particularly in Te Tiriti), and in the 2020 Public Service Act. We, the people, believe; shared, participatory governance will be a highly beneficial in the transformation of Aotearoa NZ, to a modern, equitable, engaged democracy and civil society which sustains its citizens.

To date most "change" efforts in our public sector have been limited to digitisation, digital services/apps, process automation or automated decision making. There is very little transformative, cultural or structural change and very little meaningful participation by the public. For all the "investment" in technology, we are seeing increasing adoption of automated, unexplainable and unaccountable systems, with a proliferation of inconsistent and often undignified services that create social exclusion. There is little digital infrastructure we can rely upon, have had a hand in designing and are able to change. There is now greater demand from communities for transformation of this status quo than ever before, but no strategy to undertake it.

Gov Zero Aotearoa is a civil society initiative to connect and welcome all people to take action — dream and build better futures, by building the digital civic-cultural-economic infrastructure that supports them, together.

In year one we intend to co-create visions of the optimistic futures we want to work towards, pessimistic futures we want to avoid, exemplars of what great public services and systems could look like, and digital civic-cultural-economic infrastructure to help democratise the opportunity that comes from living in a digital age – **all** in alignment with the principles, protocols and practices of mātauranga Māori. We believe this public "innovation commons" will help fuel more, purposeful, high impact and innovative digital transformation of the governance of Aotearoa's common resources for decades to come.

*We draw inspiration from the Gov Zero community in Taiwan, which has created the social and digital infrastructure to empower its citizens to tackle big problems in new ways, together, drawing on, incentivising, resourcing and rewarding the values, skills, vision, hopes and fears of all the individuals involved, across all communities and sectors. 


"Gov Zero" is a **community of open collaboration** between a diverse and passionate collective from across civil society.

Initial projects

Community repository of legislation & regulation as code with use cases (RaC)



Establish a public commons of legislation and regulation as code, with three high impact use cases that deliver immediate value to the public whilst accelerating future opportunities through a reusable, extendable platform. The initiative will grow domestic capability, demand and provides open digital infrastructure to build upon by anyone. Use cases: social services legal eligibility checker (with CABNZ), Policy Difference Engine to contrast new policies (like social insurance), and a high veracity supply chain collab. RaC & Futures will be reflected in the Service Aotearoa demonstrator

g0v/Service Aotearoa demonstrator

Deliver an amazing demo g0v/Service Aotearoa experience that people would love. Would provide a means to showcase better gov services both directly, and through third parties. Could be a good opportunity to show what integration with a self-sovereign identity like Ahau could look like. Inspired by g0v efforts from Taiwan, where a community-led demo of great gov greatly accelerated transformation of government services with participatory models to better serve and empower citizens.



Optimistic & Pessimistic futures for our communities (OPFutures)





Our charitable purpose

The Gov Zero Aotearoa community and its first projects 1 to 4 will be beneficial to the community by;



providing a dignified and supported means for all New Zealanders to easily get involved in participatory democracy, including shaping policies, services, laws and alternatives. Gov Zero will provide a politically neutral community platform and virtual space for anyone to explore what "better" could look like, and find like minded people to get there together.

engaging broadly across the communities of New Zealand to understand and represent their hopes and fears for the future to the political and public sectors, to encourage new policies and services that meet the hopes and mitigate the fears.



engaging and empowering people with complex challenges in their lives, including people with disabilities, injury, threat, fear, and digital or social exclusion, to participate in improving the social inclusiveness and suitability of public services and policies.



providing community infrastructure for the community to rely on and build upon, such as public legislation and regulation as infrastructure to openly support anyone in the community to have the means to check government actions or decisions against the law, and to be empowered to seek an explanation under Section 23 of the OIA.



establishing publicly available services to help New Zealanders understand their legal eligibility and entitlement to public services including benefits, tax credits, emergency support and other assistance. These services will be co-designed with Citizen Advice Bureau and Community Law to support people at their most vulnerable, and empower them to have greater access to social justice outcomes

The Accelerating Digital Aotearoa NZ team will invite all partners, participants and contributors to a wrap up event with a showcase of all deliverables, presentation of the reports, lessons learned, opportunities and challenges, and a chance for participants to discuss next steps.

Measuring success

Legislation & regulation as code (RaC)

RaC platform and products are being used by other organisations to build new value of avoid costs.

Public legal eligibility tool: 10,000 people use the service in NZ to determine their legal eligibility, and growth in people applying for benefits/services. High veracity decisions demonstrator: used as an example to inspire change, and invitation to help design and/or implement high veracity systems in a department.

High veracity organics supply chain: the RaC platform is used to improve compliance & consumer confidence.

Policy Difference Engine: 1,000 people interact with the system to understand policy implications, with some media coverage and public narrative about the genuine pros and cons of a Social Insurance scheme for NZ.

Each project will have success criteria and measures that both address the particular problema space, but also incentivise high impact and extendable outputs from each initiative.

Service Aotearoa demonstration

Positive feedback and demand from a demographically representative pool of 1000+ end users.

Media reporting on opportunities for improving the quality of public services nationally.

Measurable reuse of the concepts, design work, service components/platforms and/or code by cross sector organisations to improve their services to the public.

Support for a functional demonstration for how public services could interface with self-sovereign systems (lwi identity infrastructure, digital taonga, etc).

Optimistic & pessimistic futures

Over 100 fifty year futures (optimistic and pessimistic) are added to the public repository.

A cross sector collection of organisations, companies and institutes start using the futures to inform services, policies and products.

Greater public reporting on what could be, rather than what is.

Representative engagement from across sectors, communities and demographics in the work, across all projects.

Venture Centre is committed to creating the conditions for equality of opportunity to participate in increasing human flourishing and support the development of an emerging 'Aroha Economy' in Aotearoa, NZ. 
Next steps: Programme 2 coming in 2023
